


On the road

CRAFTY STOP OFFS IN SOUTHERN NSW & THE ACT



1. Nowra JUKEJEMA QUILTING BARN

Where's Nowra: A couple of hours' drive south of Sydney, with the Shoalhaven River running through the town.

Where in Nowra: 124 Kinghorne Street, Nowra, in the CBD. One block from the main street. We have off-street parking available, great for attending our classes.

Who plays host: Kim Goatcher

Worth a visit because: We are just about to celebrate our 10th year serving Nowra's patchwork needs. I offer a great range of fabrics, from reproductions to subtle brights. We have a great selection of patterns, mainly by Australian designers including Irene Blanck from Focus On Quilts and Anni Downs from Hatched and Patched. We have a selection of Cosmo threads and we now stock Australian Heirloom wools. There are lots of fun classes and workshops on offer, such as Finishing Off School and Glue Stick Girls, plus our fabulous stitching retreats. 

2. Goulburn THE SEWING PATCH

Where's Goulburn: Between Sydney and Canberra. You take the exit off National Highway 31 and follow the directions below.

Where in Goulburn: We are at 70 Cowper Street, Goulburn, which used to be called the Old Hume Highway before the freeway went in. Approaching from the north, we are on the drive out to Canberra. Turn from the main street and do a dog-leg past the Shell garage; we are on the same side. Approaching from the south, travel a few kilometres past the Big Merino, but don't go past the Shell garage. We are in a beautiful old period home.

Who plays host: Adelle Higham

Worth visiting because: The Sewing Patch has it stitched for all your sewing and handiwork needs. We have quality patchwork and dress fabrics, hand- and machine-embroidery products, tapestry and needlecraft supplies, books, designer buttons, gifts, wool, patterns exclusively from Katia, Aslan and Poem hand-knitting yarns, as well as Heirloom and, naturally, Brother sewing machines. We run classes, workshops and so much more. Large groups and bus tours welcome and we can open on Sunday by appointment.

3. Braidwood BRAIDWOOD QUILT SHOP

Where's Braidwood: Braidwood is situated in the southern tablelands on the Kings Highway, 80km from Canberra and 60km from Batemans Bay on the south coast of NSW.

Where in Braidwood: Shop 6, Albion Centre, Wallace Street. We're in the Albion Centre, which is right in the middle of Braidwood's CBD. You can see it on the left-hand side as you drive through town on the highway (which is called Wallace Street). It runs right through the centre of the village. You'll find us just a few doors away from the ever-popular Braidwood Bakery.

Where's Nicholls: Nicholls is in the northwestern corner of the ACT, close to the NSW and ACT border.

Where in Nicholls: The Cultural Centre, Gold Creek Village, O'Hanlon Place. Enter the popular tourist region of Gold Creek Village from either direction off the Barton Highway. We're near the National Dinosaur Museum.

Where's Murrumburrah: On the Burley Griffin Way, approximately one-and-a-half hours from Canberra.

Where in Murrumburrah: 330 Albury Street, Murrumburrah, on the highway nestled among beautiful heritage-style shops and eateries.

Who plays host: Sue Chesworth

Worth visiting because: It's like visiting an old friend; a smile and a warm welcome await you. There are crazy novelty prints from Loralie, bold fabrics from Frond Studios, and nostalgic fabrics from Disney with lots of complementing lines. French General and Rosie's Love Letters add a bit of elegance to the shelves. The adjoining well-equipped studio hosts a number of weekly classes as well as weekend workshops, with talented tutors Chris Jurd and Chris Timmins, both well known in the industry. I love working with people and helping them design their own individual quilts. I am just as keen when it comes to gorgeous flowers or bright geometric designs and it is very rewarding to have a customer return with their finished project to say thank you for the assistance I've given them. Where in Griffith: 434 Banna Avenue, the main street of Griffith (top block, opposite Broome's Fruit & Veg's). Just look for the Janome signs.

Who plays host: Morganne Webb


Worth visiting because: For a small country shop we offer a wide range of items including a longarm machine quilting service, Janome sewing machines (sales, service and accessories), Horn sewing cabinets, DMC threads, patchwork fabrics, wide quilt backings, battings, haberdashery, gifts, readymade quilts, bags and knick-knacks. Our kits are known for being just like our samples, with no surprises when you get home. We also offer several block-of-the-month programs with samples on display around the shop to inspire you.

Where's Coleambally: It's a couple of hours' drive northwest of Wagga Wagga.

Where in Coleambally: 13 Brolga Place; you will find the Borolga Hotel on the corner — we're on the opposite side of the road with a bunch of other shops.

Who plays host: Lynne and Margaret

Worth a visit because: Coleambally Stitch In Time has been around for 27 years and we still love our store just as much as we did when it started. Where in Howlong: 26 Fairway Close, Howlong. Just before you enter the town of Howlong, you will notice the golf course on the left-hand side. On the right, there's the entrance to Golf View Estate. That's where you will find Whatever Where-ever Craft.

Who plays host: Helen Roach

Worth visiting because: Being the owner of a home-based business, my aim is to make the customers feel very comfortable. I pride myself on old-fashioned service and will go out of my way to help you. Two years ago, I converted the front room of our house into a shop, which is now lined with more than 1000 bolts of quality cotton fabric. It has since outgrown this space and now meanders down the hallway and into the lounge. Among the fabrics you will find a large selection of jelly rolls, layer cakes, patterns, books, kits and so much more. "Sit and Sew" days are very popular and are run every Wednesday and Thursday from 10am-2pm. Like the shop, these days are very laid-back. Occasionally there is a more formal class, where we all learn a project together.
