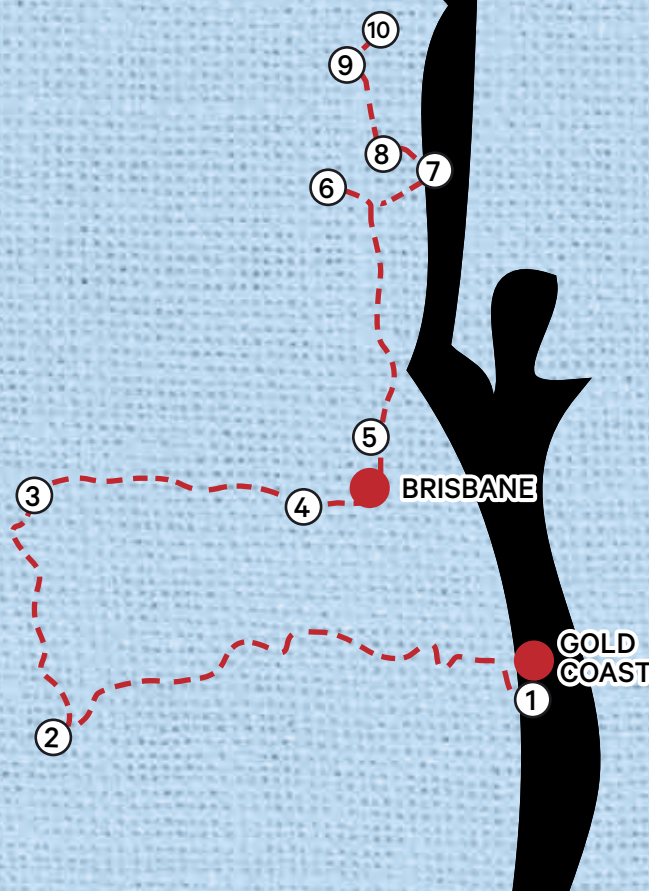

3. Toowoomba PRECIOUS TIME

Where's Toowoomba: The beautiful garden city of Toowoomba is just over an hour west of Brisbane.

Where in Toowoomba: Our sweet little shop is on the corner of David Street and Holberton Streets. As you approach, turn off the New England Highway into Griffiths Street and continue down until it changes to Hogg Street, then turn left into Holberton Street.

Where in North Ipswich: 2 Pine Mountain Road. Located near the Railways Workshops Museum and on the way to the Australian Salad Bowl (the Lockyer Valley), the store is actually in the old post-office building.

6. Maleny MALENY MAGIC PATCHWORK AND QUILTS



Where's Maleny: The town of Maleny is in the hinterland above the Sunshine Coast, with beautiful views of the range.

Where in Maleny: 924 Maleny Montville Road. Our store is situated 5km from the Maleny township along Balmoral Ridge on the road to Montville. We are just past the Maleny Cheese Factory, which is worth a visit, along with the Mary Cairncross Reserve and the Botanical Gardens.

7. Warana KIMZ SEWING AND PATCHWORK CENTRE

Where's Warana: Warana is between Caloundra and Mooloolaba on the beautiful Sunshine Coast, about an hour's drive north from Brisbane.

Where in Warana: 1/5 Main Drive. If travelling from the south, just hop off the Bruce Highway onto Caloundra Road, turn left at the first roundabout and follow the signs to Kawana. Turn off to the right at Main Drive, and we are approximately 1km up Main Drive on the right hand side – easy!

Who plays host: Owner Kim Turner, along with her fantastic staff, Christine, Pamela and Rhonda.

Worth visiting because: When you first step inside, you'll notice all of our gorgeous quilts hanging on the walls and the bed we have in the shop. We have a large range of classes and workshops we run in store all the time, and we just love to teach our customers how to get the most out the sewing machine they've just purchased. Our



store is really all about educating people on what tool is the right tool for whatever you might be working on, so if you have any questions, please ask us. We also offer online shopping, so visit our website and view our range.

What we recommend: We know full well how important it is to have the right needle for your sewing, and we have a great range of machine needles to choose from, but we do love the Superior Titanium Topstitch Needle for most jobs. These needles have a large eye to make threading easier and feature a front groove to channel the thread and prevent friction. The titanium coating keeps them sharp five times longer than ordinary needles, so they are needle-collection essentials.

Where in Forest Glen: Old Church, 343 Mons Road. In the old church in Forest Glen, just opposite the shops. Take exit 200 off the Bruce Highway.

Who plays host: Penny and her team of angels.

Worth visiting because: Not only will you be delighted by the fabulous range of patterns, fabrics, notions and more when you visit our store, but you will also see lots of lovely quilts and samples on display – inspiration in every corner! 9. Cooroy COOROY DRAPERY

10. Cooroibah FABRIC PATCH



Where's Cooroibah:

Cooroibah is 15 minutes' drive from Noosa on the Sunshine Coast. It's a lovely quiet area away from the hustle and bustle – we even have kangaroos in our backyard! It's close
