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1. Hount Gambier CREATIVELY SEWN



Where's Mount Gambier: Famous for its Blue Lake and known as the hub of the Limestone Coast, Mount Gambier is situated in the south east of South Australia, very close to the Victorian border. It's about 450km from both Adelaide and Melbourne and provides a welcome break when travelling between these cities. Where in Mount Gambier: We are at 1 Anthony Street. I have made good use of a local heritage cottage by turning it into a hub for sewing and craft activities. Who plays host: Owned by Kerry Hurst



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Worth visiting because: Creatively Sewn offers an Aladdin's Cave of fabrics, haberdashery, threads, books, stabilisers and battings. As the region's Pfaff and Baby Lock dealership, I offer a full range of these machines and accessories. A highly qualified sewing-machine mechanic is available to support Pfaff and Baby Lock machines. I also stock the Accuquilt GO! Cutter ranges. You'll find machine- and hand-stitchery requirements and notions filling the shelves, including Sashiko kits, while my fabric stock always follows the latest trends, brands and colourways including Tilda, Moda, William Morris, Hoffman batiks and more, balanced with a good supply of Oriental and blender fabrics, and, there is no minimum cutting limit! 2. Naracoorte ARTS ON ORMEROD



Where's Naracoorte: Located in the Limestone Coast region of south-eastern South Australia, about three and a half hours' drive from Adelaide and half an hour from the Coonawarra wine district. Where in Naracoorte: 13 Ormerod Street. Turn off Riddoch Highway and head for the town centre. Our heritage-listed building is located at the small roundabout on Ormerod Street, between the entry and exit to Riverside Drive. Customer parking is available at the rear of the building.

Who plays host: Owners Tim and Cath Rowe - both local identities with a long history of business in Naracoorte. Their nieces, Ruth Dickenson and Deb Tarca, both help out, with Deb running the store on Thursdays and Fridays, and Deb and Ruth are often there together on Saturdays.

3. Lamerod watt knots & notions



Where's Lameroo: A town in the Murray-Mallee region, Lameroo is on the Mallee Highway and Pinnaroo railway line about 40km west of the Victorian border, or 210km east of Adelaide. It is primarily a service town for the surrounding rural areas, growing grain and sheep.

Worth visiting because: The business was originally an art-supply and custom-framing store (founded by Tim and Cath), housed in a beautiful heritage building. We have only recently expanded into the areas of patchwork, quilting, knitting and haberdashery since Ruth and Deb started working here. Our range of around 250 bolts of patchwork fabric is very eclectic, with ranges from Liberty Art Fabric, Tula Pink, Kaffe Fassett, Tilda, Robert Kaufmann and Jane Sassaman, just to name a few, and we're constantly expanding the ranges. We also have a large range of knitting wools, patterns and all sorts of accessories, along with DMC threads, haberdashery from Gütermann, Clover, Schmetz and Birch. Of course we still have a large range of high quality art supplies for the serious artist, and Deb continues to offer a custom-framing service. 4. Flagstaff Hill WIDEBACKS AUSTRALIA



Where's Flagstaff Hill: We're 15 minutes from Glenelg, about 25 minutes south of the city. An easy-to-find, quiet, beautiful location amongst gum trees and koalas. Where in Flagstaff Hill:

6. Gauder KORNACRAFT SEWING CENTRE

As Chris and I are not local residents of Gawler we felt it was important to employ staff from the local area.

Worth visiting because: You will be amazed at the range of goodies we stock in our shop. We have a sewing centre area at the entrance with Brother, Janome, Elna and Babylock machines on display to tempt you. Then as you walk further in the store, you pass the haberdashery section with ribbons, lace, cotton and all the essential sewing tools. Then you enter the magical area where a large table sits in the middle and the walls are lined with a riot of colour from fabric neatly arranged on shelving units. This is the class area and where you can see all the fabric on display at a glance. The table invites you to spread out your fabrics to match and compare.

9. Jumby Bay PATCHES AT THE BAY

Worth visiting because: Patches at the Bay is not an average craft and quilting store. We're run by a group of dedicated women who do it for the community - we're volunteers! Our unique

venture had an unusual beginning. The local supermarket was the only place in Tumby Bay to get fabrics, wool and notions - so when the shop was sold and the new owner was thinking of getting rid of this department, a local lady stepped in to save the supply source. She proposed that an alternative location be found in town for the fabrics, wool and haberdashery and persuaded other like-minded women to be volunteers and thus Patches at the Bay was born. We've operated the business since October 2003 and provide a friendly atmosphere for our customers. As well as patchwork fabrics, we stock a huge range of wool, haberdashery and general craft supplies. We try to source what our customers need whenever possible so the stock is changing constantly, something we see as a real strength of the store, and we provide lots of inspiring workshops as well as holiday classes for the kids.
