

1. Esperance PATCHES N THINGS

Where's Esperance: Just west of the western corner of Israelite Bay, Esperance is 700km southeast from Perth and 400km due south from Kalgoorlie (the Golden Mile). It takes about seven hours to drive from Perth, one and a half hours by air and three days by cruise ship – so many choices!

Where in Esperance: Suite 1/120 Dempster Street. Driving in from the north on Coolgardie/Norseman Highway, it will turn into Dempster Street, so just follow your nose to McDonald's, and we are diagonally opposite the McDonald's. Go through the door for Bernie's Carpets, which is a family business we share our premises with.

Who plays host: Debra and Sheila with our other gorgeous ladies, Sharon, Olwyn and Margaret.

Worth visiting because: We are an interesting craft store, a bit like Aladdin's cave. We have fabrics for patchwork and apparel, along with wool/yarn, tapestry and embroidery threads.
