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1. Howard VANCOOTENS HOWARD DRAPERY

4. Quindaberg & Gladstone THE FABRIC PALETTE & SEW DARN FINE

Where are Bundaberg & Gladstone: You'll find Gladstone just south of Rockhampton, on the coast right near Curtis Island. Travel a bit further south and inland and you'll find Bundaberg.
