Double (woven) chevron stitch RIGHT-HANDED



Work a foundation row of chevron stitch first (see the $oldsymbol{ol}}}}}}}}}}}$ or contrasting thread to begin the second row, left to right.



Form the small stitch at the opposite side of the line directly below (or above) the first small stitch. Then pass the needle under, not through, the first slanting stitch.




 $3\,\mathrm{Sew}$ the next small stitch between the short stitches of the foundation row. You are sewing two interwoven rows of chevron stitch in one line.



Then go down over the foundation row for the second 4 slanting stitch and make another small stitch between the next two of the foundation row.



Continue alternating the slanting stitches under and 5 Continue alternating the Statisting Statistics of Statis complete this highly decorative border stitch.



The reverse side shows the pairs of small stitches in the two colours. You could also work chevron or double chevron stitch over braid or ribbon for another look.
